### FESTIVAL TEAM

#### **BENJAMIN ELLIN - MUSICAL DIRECTOR**

Award-winning and critically acclaimed British conductor and composer Benjamin Ellin is currently co-founder and Musical Director of De Mowbray Music and the De Mowbray Music Festival, Music Director of the Thursford Christmas Spectacular, co-founder, conductor and composer of the contemporary-fusion ensemble Tafahum, Principal Conductor of the Slaithwaite Philharmonic Orchestra and President of Pembroke Academy of Music, London. Benjamin is also a founding trustee of the Evgeny Svetlanov Charitable Trust.

Over two decades Benjamin has developed an international reputation for being able to unite groups, organisations and audiences across a wide-range of projects as well as being fearless in his commitment and belief to bold programming, inclusivity and collaborative projects. This can be seen by his ongoing work in North Yorkshire through the De Mowbray Music



Festival in Thirsk, the contemporary-fusion ensemble Tafahum, opera festivals and performances across the UK including Focus Opera (2007 – 2015), a wide commitment to outreach and development work in settings from projects in prisons and refugee camps to university departments as well as curating projects and collaborations with leading ensembles across the globe.

As a composer his output is diverse and far-reaching. From solo concert works to symphonies, film scores to cross-arts commissions, Benjamin's music has been performed and broadcast all over the world; in the concert hall, theatre and for the screen. In 2022 Benjamin was commissioned by the Evgeny Svetlanov Conducting Competition to compose a symphony to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the passing of Svetlanov himself. Ellin's Symphony No. 1 was premiered under Dmitri Jurowski in 2022 in Moscow to great acclaim while his Sinfonia No. 1 was performed at the Royal Opera House in London with the Royal Ballet School in 2017 as part of their Summer Showcase.

In 2020 Benjamin received the first British commission for a bass trombone concerto from Opera North. 'Gresley' was subsequently premiered by bass trombonist Christian Jones and Opera North in October 2021 and formed part of a major album release alongside other major works for trombone by Benjamin in 2023. The album, Windows, which features soloists Joseph Alessi, Blair Sinclair and Christian Jones was reviewed as "Melodically appealing, harmonically adventurous, rhythmically exciting and brilliantly orchestrated. Probably my disc of the year so far and it will be a hard one to beat." Paul RW Jackson, British Music Society.

### FESTIVAL TEAM

#### EMILY TAYLOR - PROJECT MANAGER

Emily is co-founder and Project Manager of De Mowbray Music, as well as the De Mowbray Music Festival. Over the last four years, Emily has managed a number of exciting events including jazz nights, orchestral and choral days along with the Sunday Concert Series and the Thirsk Hall Festival/De Mowbray Music Festival events. 2024 projects have included a Youth Performance Day where young musicians performed a solo and were given feedback from a panel of professional musicians, as well as the third orchestral Come and Play Day, with Shostakovich's Symphony No.5 and Sibelius' Karelia Suite rehearsed in a day with over 40 musicians.



While studying for a Music degree at Huddersfield University between 2011-2014 , majoring in performance on both oboe and flute, Emily joined

the Slaithwaite Philharmonic Orchestra on oboe and cor anglais. During her time at the orchestra Emily has been on tours to France, the Isle of Man and two New Year tours in China; one as principal oboe. In April 2023, Emily performed Sibelius' Swan of Tuonela with the Slaithwaite Philharmonic in Huddersfield Town Hall.

Emily's early professional career began as a Secondary School Music Teacher in 2018, having completed a PGCE at Manchester Metropolitan University. After teaching for two years in Darwen, Lancashire, Emily then taught Music at Ripon Grammar School and Queen Ethelburga's Independent School, near York.

Since leaving classroom teaching, Emily began working for Nudge Education, a service that works with chronically disengaged young people, transitioning them back into education. Having worked as a 1:1 practitioner with young people, in November 2022 Emily became Regional Lead for Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. Emily combines her work at Nudge with her own private flute teaching business in North Yorkshire. She currently teaches in Ripon and Bedale.

King and I. He has also worked at the Thursford Christmas Spectacular for numerous seasons, alongside the music director of the De Mowbray Festival, Benjamin Ellin. Daniel is currently the Assistant Musical Director for Kiss Me, Kate at the Barbican Theatre in London. He is delighted to be performing at the De Mowbray Music Festival 2024, and hopes you all enjoy a wonderful weekend of music making!

#### Guest Vocalist - Eleanor Sandars



Eleanor is an acclaimed singer from Bristol where she made her professional debut with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra at the Proms in the Close.

Eleanor was a member of NYMT before completing her training at East 15 Acting School.

Eleanor recently performed her own cabaret show, "So I'm Not A Princess?"—a coming-of-age story told through iconic princess and musical numbers—at Rural Arts in Thirsk.

Eleanor has been a featured guest soloist with Slaithwaite Philharmonic Orchestra. Her performances with the orchestra include performing with John Lees' Barclay James Harvest, at their Jubilee Concert and the closing night of the open air proms at Tatton Park.

Eleanor is the resident villain at the Compass Theatre playing the roles of Queen Rat in Dick Whittington, Wicked Step Mother in Cinderella, The Queen Of Hearts in Alice in Wonderland and will be playing The Wicked Queen this Christmas in Snow White.

#### Guest Vocalist - Alexander Barria



Half-Swedish, half-Chilean and born in Stockholm, Alexander trained at the Royal Academy of Music in London.

Alexander has been working all over the world, especially within the musical theatre genre.

Alexander's credits include:

Will Rock You 2 (Workshop); and Jamie Lloyd's Evita, Regent's Park Open Air Theatre and The Barbican. Alexander also works in front of the camera for different projects and is a regular voice-over actor. When not acting, Alexander enjoys giving masterclasses and coaching at different Universities and Academies in Sweden.

#### Requiem in D Minor, K 626 by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

The Requiem was incomplete when Mozart died in 1791. Commissioned by Count Franz von Walsegg-Stuppach, who intended to pass the work off as his own, Mozart worked on this alongside Die Zauberflöte and La clemenza di Tito. While the two operas were finished by the composer, the Requiem was not. Due to the Count's intentions, agreements took place in secret and Mozart was instructed not to make copies or divulge his involvement in the composing of the Mass.

On 4th December 1791, friends of Mozart's attended a sing-through of the score as it was, but Mozart died the following day and only the first movement was complete. Some of the other movements had rough sketches with vocal lines and figured bass, and some were completely unwritten.

Mozart's wife, Constanza, asked close acquaintances of Mozart to complete the work. Josef Eybler and Abbé Maximilian Stadler were two of the people who attempted to complete the Requiem but handed it back to Constanze still incomplete. In the end it was a pupil of Mozart's, Franz Xaver Süssmayr, who completed the work, having spent time before Mozart's death discussing ideas and orchestrations and using Eybler and Stadler's additional notes to help him.

The completed work was given to the Count after a copy was made of the score. Although Süssmayr wasn't mentioned, Mozart's contemporaries knew that the composer had died before the completion of the work. The complete score and Mozart's original manuscript survived and are now in the Vienna State Library.

The Süssmayr version will be performed this evening.

### CAMBRIDGE CHAMBER CONSORT

The Cambridge Chamber Consort (C3) was formed by Sowerby residents Ruth and Dan Sladden, who met whilst Choral Scholars at adjoining colleges in Cambridge (Clare and King's respectively). Since its inception, C3 has been made up almost entirely of Cambridge Choral Scholars who have sung together now for over thirty years. Today we are pleased to welcome a number of the founder members' children to the ranks, all of whom were cathedral choristers and are now accomplished singers in their own right. We are also delighted to be joined by the members of the exciting new ensemble Durham Voices, who will be presenting their own concert here at noon tomorrow.

C3 has performed at various venues and festivals including St Oswald's for Sowerby Music, Ripon Cathedral (several times, including Bach's St John Passion), the Northern Aldborough Festival (with Voces8 and the late Sir Stephen Cleobury), and at Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford. We sing together because we love to do so and we hope our passion is evident in our performance.

### SUMMERTIME PETER & THE WOLF



#### Peter & the Wolf - Sergei Prokofiev

Peter & the Wolf was written in 1936 when Natalya Sats, the director of a Children's Theatre in Moscow commissioned a piece of educational music. Prokofiev agreed to compose the piece which introduces children to the specific sounds of the orchestra, including:

- Flute the Bird
- Oboe the Duck
- Clarinet the Cat
- Bassoon the Grandfather
- Timpani the Hunters
- French Horn the Wolf
- Strings Peter

Each of the characters is introduced at the start of the piece.

The piece follows Peter as he journeys beyond the garden fence, helping his animal friends as they try to outwit the wolf, but will they succeed?

Over the years, the piece has had many famous narrators, including Leonard Bernstein, David Tennant, Sting, Patrick Stewart and Sophia Loren. Today's performance will be narrated by Mike Barfield.


